



NOAH AND THE ARK

(Genesis 6)

The people forget God and do evil things. This brings sorrow to God's heart. Only Noah lives a godly life. For this reason, God says to him: "Build a large boat of gopher wood. Go into the ark with your whole family. Take a pair of each kind of animal and sufficient food. I will save you, your family and these animals." Noah does all this, and God seals the door of the ark behind him and the animals.

The children learn that Noah was saved. He was obedient to God.

Some scenes are displayed and supported with verses.



The happening can be told with a picture book or a series of individual pictures.



Utilizing a cardboard box and building blocks, or other material (e.g. table, chair, towel) the children build an ark or make a poster.



On the flannel board the children can gather pairs of animals and play the entry into the ark. We play a game: The children memorize a number of pairs of different animals and then close their eyes. The teacher (or another child) removes one animal pair. When the children's eyes are opened again they guess which animal pair is missing, because it has gone into the ark.
